Approval of Minutes

The minutes of May 15, 2007 were approved as submitted.

Trustee Lou Monville called the Committee on Collective Bargaining meeting to order. Vice Chancellor Jackie McClain recognized Mr. Bill Candella, interim senior director of labor relations, who presented the California State University's initial proposal to Unit #10, the International Union of Operating Engineers (IUOE).

The Committee then heard presentations from various union representatives.

Dr. Charles Goetzl, president of Academic Professionals of California (APC) commented that the contract implementation is going very well. He then thanked Presidents Rollin Richmond, Stephen Weber, and James Rosser, of Humboldt State University, San Diego State University, and CSU Los Angeles, in their collaborative efforts of resolving specific complex issues to satisfactory conclusions. Furthermore, he's encouraged by the other campuses adoption of APC's current grievance resolution process that he sees as a sign to an early stage of a systemwide implementation.

Mr. Pat Gantt, president of California State University Employees Union (CSUEU) expressed his dissatisfaction of CSU having no signed state budget to date and encouraged the CSU to change the trend by establishing a higher level of securing funding. Mr. Dennis Dillon, stated that he appreciated the reorganization of the CSU's Labor Relations.
