

START UP

STUDENT GOVERNMENT & LOCAL ROTARY

- The WCC Food Pantry was initiated as an effort by our Associated Student Government, ASWCC, to benefit hundreds of students suffering food insecurity.
- They applied for and were awarded a grant by a local rotary, The Woodland Sunrise Rotary Foundation.
- This startup grant in the amount of \$12,650 was used for all initial costs associated with starting up a food pantry. IE. Equipment
- College administration identified and dedicated a space for the food pantry.



GENERAL INFORMATION

- Hours of Operation: Monday-Friday 8am-5pm Appointments available upon request.
- Location: Student Services Building, 700.
- Staffing: Student Outreach & Engagement Specialist, Isabel Dueñas, Student Ambassadors and Veteran's Services.
- Provides: non-perishable food items, along with personal hygiene, baby products, and occasional seasonal produce provided by our Agriculture Department.

POINT SYSTEM

Students are eligible to visit the food pantry 2x a week and take up to 15 points per visit.

Coordinated by StudentEngagement & OutreachSpecialist and staffed by volunteers





- Students expressed feelings of stigma towards food insecurity.





CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, SACRAMENTO

- ASI Food Pantry
- Provides food and basic necessities to Sac State students in need at no cost.
 In addition to helping alleviate hunger within our student community, the ASI Food Pantry aims to decrease the impact that food insecurities have on the academic success of our students.



•The ASI Food Pantry operates on a point system. Each registered Sac State student is allotted one visit per week and up to 16 points per visit. Students may take a variety of items which are separated into three categories.



Pop Up Food Pantry

 Partnership with the Central Downtown Food Basket to distribute free produce to students.
