⁵ Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) is an electronic system that allows a CalFresh participant to pay for food using their CalFresh benefits. Capability for this varies across campuses and campus vendors.

⁶ In the current environment, CalFresh application assistance is offered at all campuses via a number of ways (depending on local context). This can include support via email, telephone, and video call.

⁷ Basic Needs Ambassador Training prepares students, faculty, and staff with information and knowledge to be champions for students' basic needs in and outside of the classroom.

⁸ Clothing closets provide students with clothing, particularly business attire for job interviews. Often, this program is operated by other areas of the campus.

⁹ Financial Literacy Workshops equip students with knowledge to make informed decisions with their money.
